MADE TO SERVE

Leprosy and blindness and deafness — oh, my. The disabilities cured by Jesus in His public ministry really are quite something, aren't they? Vividly symbolic and rich food for reflection. It just wouldn't be the same if Jesus had cured eczema or athlete's foot or compulsive nail-biting.

Blind Bartimaeus, sitting by the side of the road, in particular captures my imagination. Because I have a confession to make, sometimes, I like to sit in the darkness, even though I know it isn't very good for me.

Well, listen: it's just easier, isn't it? You don't have to care about or fix the problems you can't see. No one expects you to rush to someone's aid if you don't see their injuries. The darkness is a good place to be, if you don't feel very brave or very smart or very able.

And when Jesus passes you by, if your whole world is darkness, it's easy enough to pretend you just didn't notice Him at all.

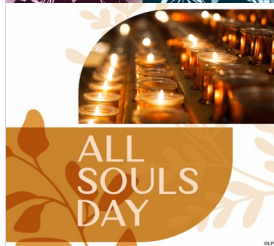
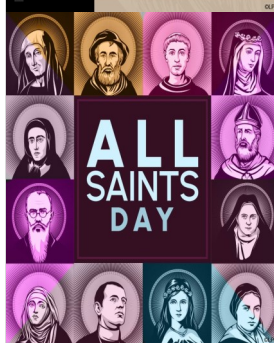
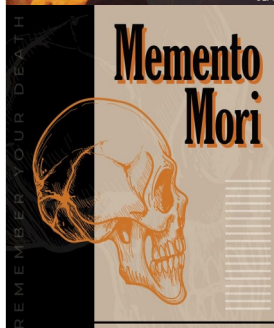
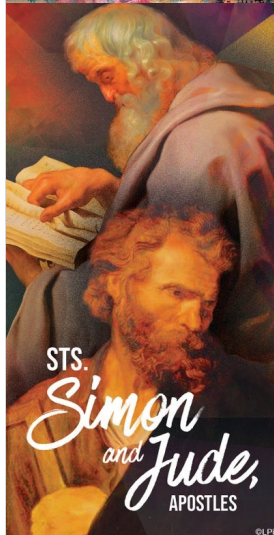
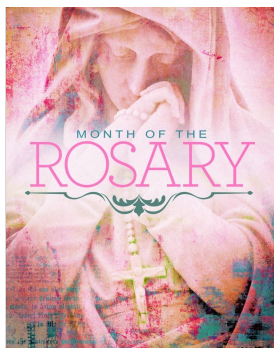
But Bartimaeus chose not to stay in his darkness. More than that, he cried out to be released from it, even when everyone around him told him to shut up. He was so persistent that he caught the notice of Jesus, and when he heard those words — "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you!" — what did he do? He didn't stammer and run away. He had courage. He got up.

It takes courage to ask for what you need to follow Christ. Because if you ask for it, you'll get it. And then begins the terrifying, wonderful journey of discipleship — testifying to what you have seen. Life in the light, no longer sitting by the side of the road but on the road, journeying toward the greatest destination of all.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks us.

Do we have the courage to answer him?

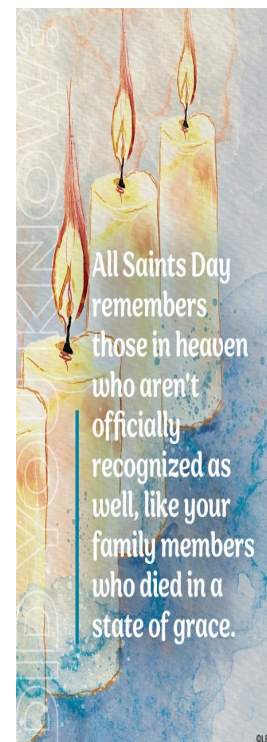
### K OF C RAFFLE TICKET FUNDRAISER

## OPPORTUNITIES TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. ~ from the *United States Catholic Catechism for Adults*

Funds raised: \$48,669.82 (19.66%)

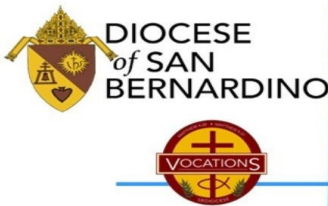

## SAINT OF THE WEEK: VENERABLE ANNE DE GUIGNÉ

In official Church procedures there are three steps to Sainthood: a candidate becomes "Venerable," then "Blessed" and then "Saint." **Venerable** is the title given by the Church to a candidate for Sainthood whose cause has not yet reached the beatification stage but whose heroic virtue has been declared by the Pope.

Venerable Anne de Guigné had a profound understanding of Jesus' presence in the Holy Sacrament. She developed a strong personal relationship with Jesus, declaring that she loved to talk with "little Jesus."

Venerable Anne de Guigné (1911-1922) was born in Annecy-le-Vieux, Savoy, France to a wealthy family. She was the oldest child of four and by all accounts, a tyrant as a toddler. However, her early years were shadowed by the First World War. Her father was killed in action when she was just 4 years old. After her father's death, to comfort her mother, she became kind and obedient in everything. Anne made her First Communion at just 6 years old, which at the time still required a special dispensation because she was so young. Anne had a profound understanding of Jesus' presence in the Holy Sacrament. She developed a strong personal relationship with Jesus, whether in Mass, after Mass in prayer at the tabernacle, or at home, she declared that she loved to talk with "little Jesus." The grace of these prayerful conversations gave her a deep understanding of the reciprocal love between Jesus and his faithful.

When Anne was just 8 years old the first symptoms of the disease that would take her life appeared. But though her face was often disfigured from the pain, she offered her suffering as a sacrifice to God. She is attributed with saying, "we have many joys on earth, but they don't last; the one that lasts is to have made a sacrifice." At just 10 years old, Anne died of meningitis. The cause for her sainthood was begun in 1932 and on March 3, 1990, she was declared venerable by Pope John Paul II.

## *Help The Knights Defend The Faith with Apologetics*

*"Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence." -1 Peter 3:15-16*

**Objection:** Baptism is only a symbol. We do not receive the Holy Spirit when we are baptized.

"Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he can not enter the kingdom of God.""- John 3:5

### **Answer:**

The water and the Spirit are one in the same act. When Jesus was baptized with water the Spirit fell on Him. The water and Spirit are not separate as non-Catholics might say. You are not baptized with water and then baptized with the Spirit. Some may claim that the water represents a woman's amniotic fluid and that birth represents baptism. This is not Biblical nor is there any proof this was taught or believed in the early Church.

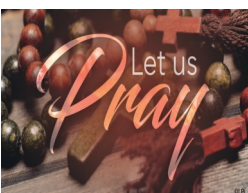
**W**ho we are...
